State of Emergency Extended for Snow Removal

Vehicles must be removed from certain city streets for snow removal

SCHENECTADY – Mayor Gary McCarthy has extended and modified the State of Emergency in the City of Schenectady until 7:00 am on December 19, 2020. Residents are advised to remove vehicles from city streets to allow for efficient snow removal.

Any vehicle parked on the following city streets between 6:00 am and 6:00 pm on Friday, December, 18, 2020 may be ticketed and towed:

- Front Street (Mohawk Avenue to Washington Avenue)
- Green Street (North Ferry to Erie Boulevard)
- North Ferry Street
- South Ferry Street (State Street to Union Street)
- North College Street (Union Street to Front Street)
- Governor's Lane
- Ingersoll Avenue
- North Street
- Washington Avenue

- Prospect Street
- Vale Place
- Porter Street
- Windsor Terrace
- Landon Terrace

- Eagle Street
- Maple Avenue
- Swan Street
- Hawk Street

- Eastern Parkway (McClellan Street to Ashmore Avenue)

- Michigan Avenue (I-890 to Chrysler Avenue)

The Schenectady Municipal Parking Garage (407 Hamilton Street, Schenectady, NY 12305) is offering free parking through Sunday, December 20, 2020. Free parking will also be available at the Hon. Karen B. Johnson Schenectady County Public Library (99 Clinton Street, Schenectady, NY 12305).
